Field guide courses

Bushwise Professional Field Guide course | 23 weeks

Join students from around the world as you train to become a FGASA-certified Apprentice Field Guide. Go beyond FGASA knowledge as our experienced trainers, with over 100 years of collective experience, introduce you to additional knowledge and skills to make you a world-class safari guide. Your classroom and home for 23 weeks will be in one of our Bushwise campuses. Whether on the Greater Makalali Private Reserve or in the Greater Kruger National Park, you'll train in Big 5 territory and hear the sounds of the bush day and night.

The 23-week course is designed to combine field guiding theory with practical experience. You will be introduced to theoretical concepts in the classroom on campus by our instructors and trainers. Then head outside for safari drives and bush walks where you can see the concepts applied in the real world. Typically, you will have two training sessions a day, one in the morning and one in the afternoon. Depending on the stage of the course, your schedule may vary. At the end of each week you will be assessed on what you have learnt. On weekends you are free to study and get some rest. Every four weeks you will have one week off to study and experience your surroundings. This adds up to four off-weeks throughout the course.

This course is open to those 18 years and older. There are certain placement restrictions for under 21s, due to regulations in South Africa around professional driving permits (PrDp). See placement section for more information

The course + placement | 50 weeks

After successfully completing the 23-week course, you are guaranteed a work placement as a professional field guide at a luxury 3 to 5 star game lodge. There are also a limited number of other wildlife conservation work placements available. These include wildlife research and monitoring, anti-poaching, ecotourism lodge management, animal rehabilitation and environmental education, wildlife conservation volunteer management and wildlife breeding, and reserve management. Opportunities may also exist to be placed throughout Africa and further afield. Graduates aged 18-20 can go on placement but will not be able to guide in a vehicle until they are 21 years old, when they can legally apply for a professional driving permit (PrDp).

FGASA Apprentice Trails Guide (optional) | 14 days

After you've absorbed the theory knowledge from Bushwise's Apprentice Trails Guide qualification, it's time to get practical experience with rifle handling and walking in areas with potentially dangerous game.

Join our partner organisation Lowveld Trails Co. in the Timbavati Private Nature Reserve, a 53,000-hectare reserve that's part of the Greater Kruger National Park and known for its iconic white lion population. You will spend the first eight days at a tented camp, walking an average of seven hours a day. During this time, a FGASA-endorsed Professional Special Knowledge and Skills Dangerous Game (SKS DG) Trails Guide and Mentor will guide you through 75 hours of walking in a potentially dangerous game area. They will also deliver ten hours of one-on-one mentorship and guide you through 20 encounters with potentially dangerous game. These practical experiences are more than the minimum required by FGASA to be assessed for their Apprentice Trails Guide qualification, ensuring that you are fully prepared for the assessment phase. On day nine you will start a wilderness backpack trail during which you will camp out under the stars. These three days will function as your assessment. The program also focuses on additional valuable skills such as trail guiding techniques such as tracking, trailing and wildlife survival skills.

Become a FGASA NQF2 qualified field guide, with additional qualifications in CyberTracker Track & Sign, Wilderness First Aid and Reptile Handling. You'll be more than equipped to enter this competitive industry.

You will spend 59 nights and 60 days in the pristine Limpopo bushveld. You'll gain invaluable inperson experience as you walk or drive through the bush – observing animal behaviour, identifying plant, animal and bird species while learning from the best. This course is focused on exposing you to as much real-world guiding experience and knowledge as possible in just two months.

Wildlife Conservation program | 12-24 weeks

Experience conservation first-hand through our wildlife conservation programs at Karongwe Private Game Reserve (KPGR) near Kruger National Park, South Africa. Join other wildlife enthusiasts, budding conservationists, and nature-lovers as you monitor large predators and mega-herbivores on the reserve.

You'll join us for three to six months – living in the African bush, working with a research team, sharing meals around the fire, and gaining life-changing experience. Spend your days learning research techniques, gaining new skills and knowledge, and assisting with a variety of research projects.

Activities and research opportunities include:

- General predator and mega-herbivore monitoring including hyena, leopard, lion, cheetah, elephant, rhino and buffalo
- Monitoring their distribution, feeding ecology and competition
- Sustainability, distribution and sex, and age ratios
- Community outreach and environmental education

Online courses: program structure

Nature Enthusiast FGASA online course | 8 weeks

Become an African nature and wildlife expert. Attend expert-led masterclasses, learn through engaging discussions and earn a certificate from the top-rated provider of field guide qualifications.

This is designed for anyone – high school students, new graduates, mid-career professionals with a bit of free time and a passion for nature, retirees, and citizen scientists. It is for self-enrichment and improving your knowledge in general, or for tipping your toes into the possibility of a wildlife career. The FGASA Nature Enthusiast online course is certified by the Field Guides Association of Southern Africa and aligned with the FGASA Apprentice Field Guide (NQF2) qualification.

On this course you'll complete the first 16 official FGASA modules. Topics include African mammals, plants, birds, reptiles, amphibians, insects and fish. You'll also learn about African ecosystems, geology, climate and even astronomy. This online wildlife course goes beyond the basics, delivering additional NQF2 and NQF4 knowledge and preparing you for further training if you'd like to become a safari guide or conservationist.

As with all Bushwise courses, we cover so much more than the fundamentals. By attending our masterclasses, you'll gain specific insights into elephant, pangolin and vulture conservation. You'll also learn about innovative conservation strategies and how anti-poaching initiatives are run. Bring your specific interests to this course and ask our certified instructors for guidance. We're here to help you get the most out of your online course.









FGASA Field Guiding online course | 12 weeks

Take your field guide training further by joining our FGASA Field Guiding online course. In just 12 weeks, you'll gain theoretical knowledge towards getting certified as an FGASA Apprentice Field Guide (NQF2). You'll be exposed to expert insight on real-life situations you might encounter. You'll also learn about the types of challenges that exist in the industry and get insider knowledge on how these situations are addressed.

This course is conducted through 21 live sessions, including lectures from industry leaders in conservation and safari guiding. Lectures cover the 16 official FGASA modules and skills of guiding, developing and conducting a guided experience, radio procedure, rifle handling knowledge and theory on viewing potentially dangerous animals. At the end of 12 weeks you will be eligible to write the FGASA NQF2 theory exam.

This is an excellent option for anyone considering a career as a field guide, but who needs the flexibility of an online course.

Requirements

General requirements for the field guide courses include:

- Age 18 and above
- · Fluency in spoken and written English
- Matric/high school graduate (or equivalent)
- · Full manual drivers licence

Work placement requirements include:

- Meeting all the course requirements and pass the FGASA Apprentice Field Guide NQF2 exam
- Ages between 21 and 39 for guiding placement
- · Ages between 18 and 21 for non-guiding placement

If you're over 39 years of age, you are welcome to join the 23-week course. However, if a placement is secured during your training, your booking can be extended.
